Meditations . . .

"Be reconciled to God." (2 Corinthians 5:20)

These four words from St. Paul are a great summary of what Lent is all about. But just what does it mean to "be reconciled to God" (2 Corinthians 5:20)?

For Paul, reconciliation with God meant to be restored to God's favor. He taught that we have all turned away from God through sin, but that in Christ, God has brought us back. By coming into this world as a man and offering himself on the cross, Jesus has repaired the breach in our relationship with God. He has done something we could never do on our own. "All this," Paul wrote, "is from God, who has reconciled us to himself through Christ" (2 Corinthians 5:18). Now the Lord asks us to receive the favor he holds out to us.

And what favor it is! We can live as sons and daughters of God; we can experience all the riches of heaven filling our hearts. Sin might cloud our relationship with him, but our heavenly Father continues to offer us his mercy. It's as if we hear God calling out to us personally as we read

We can hear our Father's pleas in today's Gospel story of the prodigal son, too. The father of the prodigal stands ready, on the lookout, to welcome his wayward younger son back into the family. And he goes out to beg his resentful older son to join him and experience the fullness of life that is already his.

Lent is a perfect season to lay hold of this restoration in a new and deeper way. And what better way to do it than through the Sacrament of Reconciliation! The examination of conscience on page 74 can help you prepare to receive this sacrament with an open heart. So let your heavenly Father restore you through the life-giving power of Jesus' death and resurrection. Listen to his voice as he pleads with you to receive all the riches of his "home." It's all there—come and receive it!

"Lord, I say yes to the reconciliation you offer me!"

"Keeping It Simple"

(Praying This Lent) By Deacon Greg Kandra - Part III

And when we communicate with a friend, it is unvarnished. and honest, and heartfelt, and true. It is fundamentally simple. That is just as it should be with God. Our relationship with God, after all, is the ultimate friendship.

But how to begin? As I said at the start: keep it simple. Start with a prayer that is short, familiar, direct. The Lord's Prayer is a good beginning—after all, it's what Jesus taught his disciples when they wanted to learn how to pray. For many of us, it's one of the first prayers we learn.

Or, if you need reassurance, consider these words from Psalm 138: "The Lord is with me to the end. . . . Never forsake the work of your hands" (verse 8). I think that may be as profound a prayer as you can find: "Never forsake the work of your hands." It says, "God you have created me. You formed me with your hands. Do not forget me." Remember me. Stay with me. Please! Give me what you know I need! It doesn't get any simpler than that.

God doesn't ask of us what we cannot give. If you don't have sixty minutes to offer a litany of prayers, take sixty seconds to pray what is in your heart. Keep it simple. And don't be afraid that it isn't enough. Whether or not we feel like we "get" God or "get" prayer, know this: God "gets" us. Not only does he get us because he made us; he gets us because he became us. When he took on human flesh in the form of Jesus, he took on thirty-three years of struggles, stumbles, hunger, and hurts.
