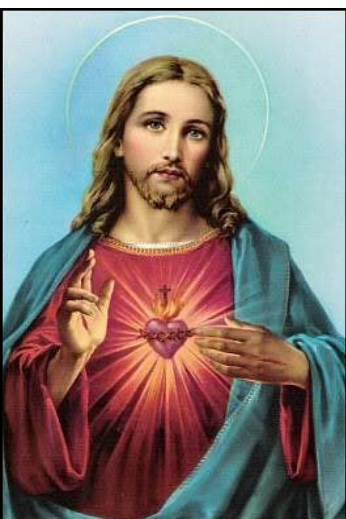

*Meditations . . .*

**“Great is your faith!”**  
(Matthew 15:28)

Only once in Matthew’s Gospel did Jesus characterize someone as having great faith. It wasn’t Peter, who professed Jesus as “the Messiah, the Son of the living God” (Matthew 16:16). Nor was it Joseph, who obeyed an angel and took Mary as his wife (1:24). No, Jesus reserved this term for an unnamed gentile woman who wouldn’t take no for an answer.

Jesus was in the territory of Tyre and Sidon when he met this woman. These cities, located south of modern-day Beirut, Lebanon, were the foremost Mediterranean seaports at the time. Evidently, the news of Jesus’ miracles had traveled far beyond the borders of Israel, because this Canaanite mother was determined to approach Jesus personally on behalf of her tormented daughter.

This mother’s strong faith stands in stark contrast to the inflexibility of the scribes and Pharisees. They had interrogated Jesus and his disciples about the fact that they didn’t wash their hands before eating (Matthew 15:2). They had standards that Jesus had to meet before they would believe.

Conversely, the Canaanite woman was eager to believe. She was hoping that Jesus would be accommodating toward her despite her religious status. Even when he initially rebuked her, she persisted. Rather than being offended, she remained open. She believed he had the power and the willingness to work a miracle. As a result, she, a Gentile, experienced his love and power: her daughter “was healed from that hour” (Matthew 15:28).

This woman’s trust endeared her to Jesus—and to readers of Matthew’s Gospel ever since. Just as Jesus commended her faith, he welcomes all of us when we come to him with humble faith. He wants to shower his healing and “mercy upon all” (Romans 11:32). So if you hesitate to bring your needs to Jesus—or to return to the sacraments after time away—let this mother’s faith strengthen yours!

**ACCORDING TO GOD’S WILL**  
(Part 2)

*Mary: Hidden and Humble before the Lord*

For the most part, Mary seems to have lived a quiet hidden life in Nazareth, first raising her son and then praying for him as he went out to minister. She is content to remain a prayerful force behind Jesus’ words and works. Even at the cross, she is a somewhat hidden figure; she speaks no words at all, although her son speaks to her. Her presence, and her sorrow, hover over the scene, but she does nothing to draw attention to herself.

Mary’s hiddenness and humility have much to teach us as we seek to live for the Lord. In an especially powerful way, her humble witness pushes back against the pride that is so prevalent in the world—as well as the pride that lurks in the quiet of our own hearts.

God Delights in Calling the Humble. When the angel Gabriel first appeared to Mary, he wasn’t visiting someone accomplished in the eyes of the world. Although she knew the Hebrew Scriptures, Mary wasn’t educated in the rabbinic schools in nearby Capernaum or Jerusalem. She lived each day as a normal Jewish woman did: serving the needs of her family as she prepared for marriage. Like her son and his disciples, Mary would have had an easily recognizable Galilean rural accent. By human standards, there was nothing extraordinary about her. (To be continued...)
