Meditations . . .

“When you hold a banquet, invite the poor.”
(Luke 14:13)

As you begin to read today’s Gospel, you might wonder, “Is Jesus really offering advice on table manners and etiquette? Is he really telling me how to win people’s esteem?”

But as you keep reading, you realize Jesus is after something else. He’s not teaching you how to make friends and influence people; he’s asking you to choose a life of humility and generosity—just as he did. Don’t try to curry favor with the wealthy. Don’t set yourself apart as someone special. Rather, get to know the “invisible people” who are usually left out. Care for the poor. Spend time with those who are disadvantaged. Learn their names and their stories.

In other words, Jesus is saying, Become like me. Imitate the One who humbly put aside his glory to live among us sinners (Philippians 2:6-7). Think of the time he spent with those who were “abandoned” (Matthew 9:36), how he joined them “at table” (9:10), and how he was not afraid to touch people who were sick and reviled (Luke 5:12-13; 7:38).

Above everything else, think of how he continues to humble himself at every Mass. Imagine: day in and day out, the all-holy Son of God generously makes himself present to the hundreds of millions who gather to worship him. In the Eucharistic gift of his Body and Blood, he gives himself to sinners, all of whom stand in need of salvation. No matter our situation, he offers each of us grace upon grace.

That’s how Jesus wants us to live: in a spirit of humility and self-giving for anyone who is hurting in any way. And he asks us to do this, not on our own strength, but by drawing on the grace that he pours into us. So fix your eyes on Jesus, the humble One, today, and let him make you a little bit more like himself.

“Lord, give me a heart like yours—the heart of a servant!”

By: Pope Benedict XVI - Part 3

Some people today live as if they never had to die, or as if, with death, everything were over; others, who hold that man is the one and only author of his own destiny, behave as though God did not exist, and at times they even reach the point of denying that there is room for him in our world.

Yet the great breakthroughs of technology and science that have considerably improved humanity’s condition leave unresolved the deepest searchings of the human soul.

Only openness to the mystery of God, who is Love, can quench the thirst for truth and happiness in our hearts; only the prospect of eternity can give authentic value to historical events and especially to the mystery of human frailty, suffering, and death.

By contemplating Mary in heavenly glory, we understand that the earth is not the definitive homeland for us either, and that if we live with our gaze fixed on eternal goods, we will one day share in this same glory, and the earth will become more beautiful. (To Be Continued)
