Meditations . . .

“You have filled Jerusalem with your teaching.”
(Acts 5:28)

The Acts of the Apostles contains such amazing stories that it can sometimes seem like we are reading a work of fiction. But that’s just not the case. Take today’s first reading, for example. There really were men and women who, in the face of severe persecution, kept filling Jerusalem with the good news. Peter and the apostles really were questioned, tortured, and imprisoned. But they didn’t back down. Instead, they replied, “We must obey God rather than men” (Acts 5:29).

It might be hard to relate to such boldness. So let’s imagine how, in our own day and age, we can “fill” the places we inhabit with the good news of Jesus Christ.


Think about a place that you go to regularly, a place that involves some waiting. Maybe it’s the school pickup line or a subway ride or the time between your classes. Now picture those places as your own “Jerusalem” (Acts 5:28). Imagine the good news of the saving love and mercy of God bubbling up inside of you, filling you with life and joy. You feel as if you can’t contain it. So instead of scrolling on your phone, you hold your head high, your smile widens, and you look around for someone to share it with.

As you keep this posture of openness and connection to the joy of the gospel, you will naturally start getting to know some of the people who are also waiting with you. That will lead to new friendships. After a while, the crossing guard might tell you about her upcoming surgery, opening up a space for you to offer to pray for her. Some of your classmates might appreciate your openness, and you could strike up a conversation about your faith. Or maybe you end up engaging with a fellow subway passenger.

This is you, filling your own “Jerusalem” with the gospel!

“Holy Spirit, give me the boldness to share the good news wherever I go.”

Remembering a Man of the Spirit (Part 2)

He accepted those teachings, as he reiterated many times. But his was a different time, facing different challenges. In his famous quote, he viewed the Church as a “field hospital,” not as a school or a retreat. He saw both the dechristianization of the West and the urgent needs of the southern hemisphere as crises that demanded a kind of all-hands-on-deck mindset. And in a world that suffered from isolation, despair, and hopelessness, it needed mercy. “The Church does not exist to condemn people but to bring about an encounter with the visceral love of God’s mercy,” he wrote in 2016, marking the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy that he had proclaimed.

He was in many ways the voice of the voiceless. He spoke for those who were driven from their homelands in search of a better life, or for security. He spoke for those suffering from environmental degradation, knowing that the poor were always the first to suffer from climate change and that the poor felt its impact most acutely. He spoke for those who, rightly or wrongly, believed that there was little room in the Church for them.

His challenge to the Church’s members, to all of us, was to go out and evangelize joyfully and fearlessly, “touching the suffering flesh of Christ in others.” He invoked the image of the shepherd who takes on “the smell of the sheep.”

The many challenges the world faces—war, injustice, widespread individualism—“breeds doubt, fear of the future and many times despair,” the pope said. "But we Christians bring a certainty: Christ is our hope,” he said earlier this year.

He was, indeed, an Apostle of Hope, which is the theme of the second jubilee year of his pontificate. In the statement announcing the start of the Jubilee Year last December, Pope Francis described hope this way: “Hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future may bring.”
