



Meditations . . .

*“He saw and believed.”
(John 20:8)*

Alleluia! Christ is risen! Today we celebrate the culmination of the longing of God’s people through the ages. In today’s Gospel, we hear that when John looked into the empty tomb, he “saw and believed” (John 20:8). His eyes were opened, and he was able to respond to what he saw with faith. As we consider the empty tomb today, let’s ask the Lord to open our eyes and give us the grace to respond with faith as well!

Throughout Lent, our Sunday Gospel readings have been preparing the way for us:

- We saw Jesus defeat the devil, clinging to Scripture to overcome his temptations (Matthew 4:1-11). We now know that Jesus has freed us from Satan’s power.
- We saw Jesus manifest his glory and give the disciples a glimpse of what was in store for them (Matthew 17:1-9). And we now believe that Jesus is inviting us into heavenly glory.
- We saw Jesus give living water to the Samaritan woman, showing us that as Messiah, he came for all people (John 4:5-42). So now we recognize that Jesus brought God’s promises to fulfillment for every person.
- We saw Jesus heal a man born blind, opening the man’s eyes to recognize him as the Son of Man (John 9:1-41). We believe now that our spiritual blindness can be healed and that we can see Jesus for who he is.
- And we saw Jesus raise his friend Lazarus from the dead, showing that he has power over death itself (John 11:1-45). We now know that we are freed from the fear of death and that death is not the end for us.

Today as you rejoice in the resurrection of Jesus, rejoice in all its effects—both in your own life and for everyone. He has conquered sin and death and the devil! All our hopes have been fulfilled in him!

[Excerpt from *The Word Among Us*]

Jim and Monica Murphy were devoted parents.

Unity by the spirit. Our century testifies to a powerful work of the Spirit drawing God’s people to be united in their love for Jesus. Never before have there been so many scholarly and theological dialogues aimed at Christian unity. There has never been a century since the Reformation when Christians of all vocations have come together so often to worship the Lord and to pray for unity.

The more the Spirit is alive and active in the hearts of God’s people, filling us with the love of Christ, the more we will desire to love those around us, even those whom we formerly ignored or even avoided. We will love them because Jesus, who loves us all, lives in us. The more in love we are with Jesus, the more we will love one another.

More than anything else, the call to unity is a call to deeper attention to the Spirit, a call to deeper conversion. As the Council Fathers taught: “There can be no ecumenism worthy of the name without interior conversion. . . . For the closer [our] union with the Father, the Word, and the Spirit, the more deeply and easily will [we] be able to grow in mutual . . . love” (Decree on Ecumenism, 7).

What Can we do? In God’s eyes, we each play a vital role: “It is the Holy Spirit, dwelling in those who believe and pervading and ruling over the entire Church, who brings about that wonderful communion of the faithful and joins them together so intimately in Christ” (Decree on Ecumenism, 2). No one is too small for such a task.
