Meditations . . .

They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don’t know where they put him. (John 20:2)

What a glorious day! It’s Easter Sunday, the day of the resurrection. Only Jesus isn’t showing up! In fact, today’s Gospel reading focuses on an absent Jesus. Mary Magdalene, Peter, and John are confronted with an empty tomb, and they don’t know where he is. So rather than rejoicing, they are disappointed, bewildered and scared.

These three disciples didn’t know what had happened to Jesus, but we do. In just a short time, he will greet Mary Magdalene and commission her to proclaim the good news (John 20:16-18). Later that day, he will appear to Peter and the apostles and breathe the Holy Spirit on them (20:22). And he will appear to them again and again before ascending into heaven (Acts 1:3).

But we don’t hear any of those stories today. Instead, we’re waiting outside the empty tomb. We believe that Jesus is risen, but we don’t see him. We have experienced our sin being washed away, but we still fall sometimes. We get occasional glimmers of the heavenly life that awaits us, but we also know times of darkness and fear. And so we live somewhat precariously, always at risk of falling to temptation.

So why bother rejoicing today? Because Jesus truly is risen, whether we see him or not! Because he truly has defeated death, and we truly do belong to him. Because we will see him one day. And until that day comes, we can experience his Spirit filling us with God’s love and gradually transforming our hearts.

Today truly is a glorious day—not because we have come to the end of our journey, but because we know that the risen Christ is walking beside us. Step-by-step, he is leading us to the throne of God—to a glory that will far surpass our wildest dreams!

A Heavenly Destiny: (Part I)
“We Are Sealed With a Glorious Promise”

When our children were born, the nurse in the hospital stamped their feet with ink for purposes of identification, security, and medical records. When we took our children home, the hospital gave us complimentary certificates with their footprints as a keepsake. These certificates, complete with the prints of those tiny feet, confirm to us and the whole world: “This child is a member of our family.” In the past two articles, we focused on a passage from St. Paul’s writings that tells us how our baptism into Jesus’ death and resurrection gives us “security” in Christ and confers on us a special “anointing” by God (see 2 Corinthians 1:21). In this final article, we are going to look at another gift that God gives us in Baptism, a gift signified by the sacred chrism that is used to anoint us. Paul describes the anointing in this way: God has “put his seal upon us and given the Spirit in our hearts as a first installment” (1:22). We’ll look at this baptismal seal through the images of a royal seal, a first installment, and a preview of heaven. (To be continued.)
